Main Points, Conclusions/Discussions, Decisions, Next Steps Fire Protection Lake County has agreed to long range concept of putting in a fire station in southern lake county Insurance restrictions are generally within a 15 mile radius of fire station One interim solution proposed is to get our own equipment for fighting fires A fellow in Chaffee county would like to donate a small fire truck for our use. This is a very urban style truck, and it appears it could be very costly to get it running and maintained. Mike McHargue has ideas for supporting south Lake County, that involves a planned Fire Boss for the area and volunteers to support the paid position. Will need to keep Dan Daily, fire chief, in the loop about whatever our intentions and ideas are. Next fire planning meeting in Leadville on the 23rd of Jan. Volunteers are available to drive folks who would like to attend. Everybody needs to talk it up!!! There are two cisterns, but one is unusable by fire service because it would take too long to draw water from it Geo Brinkworth says there is an offer to use water supply to provide water fire service. ?? will talk to John Ortiz about Pan Ark's participation in supplying water to fire service. Larry will head up the Fire Protection Committee. Members include Ahmad, Bruce, John Kester, Ric, Anita, Steve Erickson. Larry to contact Brad to determine whether the cistern in Pan Ark has been filled/checked recently. It is still a priority to establish database of residence and their locations on a road map. This could be provided in the form of a ring binder to have in each emergency services vehicle. 		
	 A sign at the entrance to each subdivision could show a map of the roads with house numbers and arrows on how to get to each place. Involving other homeowner associations of the various subdivisions would make the placement of these signs more feasible. There was an article in the Fort Collins area about a house which burned because the fire dept could not find the house. Same situation as we are facing. We could put a link to the article on the web site.
